Sack seals the deal for Geneva

Geneva's Josh Brennan picked the right time to come up with the play of his high school career.

With the Vikings leading late in the fourth quarter and host Oswego facing a 4th-and-8, Brennan sacked Panthers quarterback Chris Schulz to help seal Geneva's 17-14 victory in the Class 6A quarterfinal Saturday night.

"It feels really good," said Brennan, a linebacker who had six solo tackles. "I couldn't have done it without the rest of the defense. I was just playing for them."

After Oswego (10-2) took a 14-10 lead on a Matt Casula run, Bremen came right back and captured the lead when Chris Modjeski capped his 110-yard, two-touchdown night with a 1-yard run with 1:32 remaining to set up Brennan and his teammates' final stand.

After Modjeski's touchdown, the defense shut down the Panthers, holding Schulz and his teammates to just four plays and minus-13 yards.
